

# Unpacking Discipleship

## Principles of Discipleship

- \* We are disciples of a Person.
- We are not teaching a "subject" but introducing people to a Mystery.
- Disciples help form disciples.
- You can only lead others as far as you have gone yourself as a disciple.



## Four Pillars



#### Encounter – "Come and See"

"The purpose of evangelization is to lead people to encounter Christ." — LMD, 9

Accompany – "Follow Me"

"The response to this encounter with Christ needs accompaniment." — LMD, 14

Community – "Remain in Me"

"Evangelization invites people to the Body of Christ, which is the Catholic Church." -LMD, 16

Send – "Go, therefore and make disciples"

"Evangelization leads disciples to accept God's desire to send them on mission." — LMD, 17


Ample and abundant prayer must root all of our evangelizing efforts.

### So what do we need to know about Jesus?

We share the Gospel by proclaiming the basic story of salvation which is called the *kerygma*.

### Five Movements of the Kerygma


- 1. God is love and has created me for relationship with him.
- 2. I have broken my relationship with God by my sin.



- 4. Jesus invites me to give my life to him.
- 5. Jesus has poured the Holy Spirit into my heart to bring me to new life.



"In catechesis too, we have rediscovered the fundamental role of the first announcement or kerygma, which needs to be the center of all evangelizing activity and all efforts at Church renewal...it is the principal proclamation, the one which we must hear again and again in different ways, the one which we must announce one way or another throughout the process of catechesis, at every level and moment"
